“KAVANAH” - DO IT WITH FEELING! GREAT FEELING!

Kavanah is the Hebrew word for direction, intention, or purpose. In its simplest meaning, it refers to concentrating the mind in the performance of a religious act, ensuring that it doesn't become rote, mechanical action. It is most commonly associated with concentration and intention in Jewish prayer, but the concept of kavanah applies to all mitzvot.

Jewish authorities generally consider that proper kavanah is essential to the performance of mitzvot. The Mishnah rules that if someone happens to be passing by a synagogue at the time that the shofar was blown on Rosh Hashanah, they do not fulfill the mitzvah of shofar because they heard it only incidentally, not purposefully.

Abraham Joshua Heschel, in his classic work, “God in Search of Man”, explains that performing a mitzvah without proper kavanah is inadequate because while it might have a positive effect on the world, it leaves the doer of the mitzvah unaffected. The purpose of Jewish practice, he writes, is transformation of the soul. “A moral deed unwittingly done may be relevant to the world because of the aid it renders unto others. Yet a deed without devotion, for all its effects on the lives of others, will leave the life of the doer unaffected. The true goal for man is to be what he does.” (I call that TRUE INTEGRITY. Being what we truly are, not what we say we are.)

While kavanah is considered an essential part of all Jewish religious activity, much of the discussion of kavanah concerns prayer. A famous saying of the 11th century philosopher, Bahya Ibn Pakudah, is often quoted in

this regard: “Prayer without kavanah is like a body without a soul.” Maimonides talks about the importance of proper preparation for prayer and stresses that kavanah is essential for prayer. He instructs us to calm ourselves and prepare for prayer so that we will have full “intention” and make our prayers truly meaningful.

At BKB, we truly understand the value of prayer. We understand the inseparable role that friendships, service to others, and personal thought and energy play in our services. At BKB, we are family. It is our “intention” to live and enjoy our faith. At the last service, I saw a man in the congregation leave his seat during services to go over to a grieving woman sitting by herself, whom he did not know, and reach out to her in consolation - honoring her tears, and reassuring her that he was there for her. From the Bimah, I got “verklempt” (emotional), felt so blessed to witness this act of caring, and so proud to be a part of BKB. THAT is just one example of what makes our Temple truly special and different.

So, of course, prayers are very important.... they work. The beautiful music at services invites us to meaningful prayer and meditation. It is, however, our “kavanah”, the intention in our hearts – the feeling in our souls, which make us better people and bring us closer to G-d. BKB is a very special place. We are a caring and close family... and we are so happy you are an important part of all that.

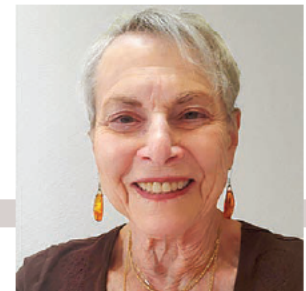
In November we won’t meet so as not to conflict with Thanksgiving. In December we will have our annual Hanukah party at my house.

Highlights of the November and December Board Meetings

November 1, 2022

- 2 Our Spiritual Leader discussed our future: He is now including a special prayer for those with yahrzeits immediately after the end of the service at the open ark on the floor. He then listed plans in the works including a veterans shabbat, a Thanksgiving shabbat, a Chanukah shabbat, a Chinese dinner, a special music shabbat honoring our Cantor, a Deli Dinner Picnic, a shabbat that honors our Sisterhood and Brotherhood, Purim, a shabbat that highlights our new members, and a wonderful Passover Seder in the spring.

- 4 The Sisterhood's programming has blossomed. Future meetings will begin at 10:00 AM. A series of great speakers are scheduled, future trips are being planned, Mah Jong cards are being sold, and the Synagogue should expect a contribution at the end of December. The Men's Club will be holding their monthly breakfasts on Mondays at 9:00 AM. Good speakers and really good food.
- 5 Gail Weiss pointed out that we need to advertise and market all the wonderful experiences that are happening at BKB. She also pointed out that our new website will offer our congregants the online availability to pay dues or contributions as you may desire.
- 6 Look for Adult Education offerings to begin after January 1st. The meeting was adjourned around 11:30 AM.

December 6, 2022

- 1 At 10:03 AM, all the usual opening events took place as our December Board Meeting began. And, to our pleasure, even the minutes were approved with corrections.
- 2 Gail Weiss, our Newsletter and Website official coordinator, led a discussion on the necessity to market BKB. Many new people keep moving to Sun City and never learn that a Synagogue exists. So, it's time we let everyone know about us. We shall now appear in the "Link," Jewish Nevada will be listing us, when someone looks online to find a synagogue, we will be highlighted there. - 3 Moreh Spector listed the secondary themes for our future Shabbat Services (with Spirituality as the primary theme). January 13 – A tribute to our Cantor and Board Installation, January 27 – the children of our congregants, February 10 & 24 – Highlighting our Sisterhood and Men's Club, and, of course, Purim followed by Pesach (Passover).
- 4 The Sisterhood and The Men's Club both reported on wonderful and well –attended events to end 2022. Watch for their future programming in your email or in the Newsletter.
- 5 The balance of the meeting included a very positive report from our treasurer, Marlene Sherman, which included information that a very generous donation was being given to BKB, and finally, the Board dealt with some personnel, membership and business issues as Boards occasionally do.
- 6 The meeting was adjourned around 11:35 AM.
